Air Conditioning Season – Warm weather is upon us. Please turn on your A/C to make sure it is cooling correctly. If you have difficulty with the A/C or thermostat, call the office for a work order.

Reminder About Flammables – Absolutely **no** flammable materials are to be kept on the premises or in storage rooms. No method of heating or cooling, other than that supplied by the landlord, is allowed.

Resident Council Nominations – CHA is accepting nominations for the Resident Council election in June. These positions are filled annually. If interested, call the office before **3:00pm, May 22, 2026**. The open positions are:

President – Responsible for conducting the purpose of the Resident Council, responsible for keeping membership informed about the activities of committees, officers, and others doing things in the name of the Clarksville Resident Council.

Vice-President – Responsible for performing duties assigned by the President. Responsible for filling the position of the President if President is ill or unable to conduct their duties.

Secretary – Responsible for keeping accurate records of all group activities. These records will be available to the Membership for inspection. Responsible for keeping up with all letters written to the group and keeping a file for all replies.

Pools & Rules

- Pools should be no deeper than 12 inches or wider than 6 feet in diameter.
- At NO time should children be left in the pool unattended.
- Pools should be emptied each night. Letting non-chlorinated water sit for extended periods of time can cause harmful germs or give mosquitoes a place to lay their eggs. It is important to fill the pool with fresh water daily. Also, by emptying out water, it lessens the hazard of unattended children entering the pool and drowning.
- Toys should not be left in or around pools. Toys can attract young children into the pool area.
- Wading pools should be moved often to avoid damage to the grounds/yard. Leaving the pool in one place can cause damage to lawns, thus causing other hazards. Tenants will be held responsible for damages to Housing Authority property.
- Pools should be stored when not in use.
- Keep pools off the grass when not in use so lawncare can mow.

EVACUATION CHECKLIST

These items are suggested for a quick evacuation depending on the urgency. You may have very little time to be out of danger. You have heard the phrase, “they got out with the clothes on their backs.”

- Cell phone and charger.
- Laptop and charging cord.
- Comfortable shoes and a change of clean dry clothes that are suitable for weather conditions. Maybe a coat or jacket.
- Personal items – Glasses, contacts, dentures, hearing aids, and related accessories for those items.
- Medications, including prescriptions and some first aid items such as pain relievers, antacids, antibiotics, nasal spray, eyedrops, N-95 facemasks, insect repellent, inhalers, sunscreen, and hygiene/sanitation items.
- Water and snacks may be needed, depending on the length of time.
- Infant formula and diapers plus clothing, medications, and a handheld game or toy.
- Personal papers including:
 - DL or ID
 - Social Security card
 - health insurance
 - passport
 - wallet and purse items, including cash
- Pets, pet food, and leashes.
- Other items, for longer periods of time, such as:
 - extra clothing
 - flashlight
 - batteries
 - portable radio
 - rain gear
 - whistle
 - writing paper
 - pencil/pen
 - book or puzzle book to pass the time.

Have a buddy system or family in case of emergency situations that you can rely on for help, transportation, or communication.

Have a bag, backpack, or suitcase ready to grab quickly. You may keep items gathered in small baggies so they can be easily put into a larger carrier. Don't make it too hard to move quickly. Time may be VERY short.
