<u>Mailbox</u> – If you have not already done so, it is extremely important for you to set up the mailbox that is assigned to you. All mail from the Clarksville Housing Authority will go to that mailbox.

<u>Yards</u> – Please take a few minutes and check your yard. Make sure you have no toys, hoses, dog leashes, anything laying on the ground a lawnmower could run over it and cause damage. Maintenance will begin mowing/mulching leaves soon. *If a mower is damaged due to tenant neglect, then repair costs may be assessed.*

<u>Trash Can</u> - Please remember to "bag" your trash before you place it in your trash can.

<u>Fire Hazards</u> – Do NOT use space heaters, the oven, or the stovetop to heat the unit. Space heaters are not allowed. The oven and stovetop are not meant to be a source of heat. Additionally, candles are not allowed in units. You may use a wax warmer, but no open flames are allowed in the units.

<u>Scholarships</u> - Scholarship awards are available to public housing residents, participants in rental assistance or similar programs, both heads of household and other family members. <u>Annual Inspection Work Orders</u> – Maintenance will be in units throughout the month to complete the necessary Annual Inspection Work Orders. If you have a date or time this is not convenient, please let us know. Otherwise, consider this your **Notice of Entry**.

<u>Holiday Bingo</u> – Bingo and snacks will be held Thursday, December 8th from 2:30-3:30pm. Directly <u>after</u> Bingo, from 3:30-4:00pm food bags will be distributed. (Quantities are limited. Only the first 60 will receive a bag.) A big thanks to Clarksville Schools' BETA Club for donating approximately 400 cans of nonperishable food items.

Remember not to nail, hook, or permanently attach inside or outside lights to the unit (you may use non-damaging clips). All holiday decorations must be removed by <u>Monday</u>, <u>January 16</u>, 2022.
